Subject: NLIB codes in ENDF formatted files.
Update of Dictionary 43.

In ENDF formatted data files the NLIB code identifies the library name. This was introduced for ENDF-6, however it is advisable to fill in the NLIB field also in ENDF-5 formatted libraries although the NLIB field was introduced only for ENDF-6. The NLIB number is essential if one wishes to work with MATERIALS selected from different libraries.

On his recent mission to CNDC, C. Dunford made the following NLIB assignments:

CENDL: NLIB = 5
JENDL: NLIB = 6
(BROND: NLIB = 7)

Note, that for the BROND version distributed by NDS, we had introduced earlier

BROND-NDS: NLIB = 35.

This had not been used in the tape BROND-NDS1 as this was in ENDF-5 format, but had been used in BROND-NDS2 which was in ENDF-6 format. It will also be used in two BROND supplement tapes that we will send out soon, one with ENDF-5 formatted data, the other with ENDF-6 formatted data.
